ENROLL YOUR FAMILY IN THE QIN

The Quality Improvement Network (QIN) is a network of child development facilities that provide comprehensive early learning and family support services to eligible infants and toddlers up to the age of 36 months and their families, at no cost. The QIN is a program of the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) and implemented with support from the United Planning Organization (UPO).

SERVICES AND SUPPORTS

Families that participate in the QIN receive a broad range of services and supports, including:

- Full-day, full-year child care services
- Health screenings
- Nutrition services
- Mental health services
- Early intervention services
- Career coaching and employment resources
- Housing resources

Once a family is found eligible for the QIN and enrolls their child at a QIN facility, they receive these services and supports until the child is 3 years old or eligible to enroll in a free pre-K program in DC.

ELIGIBILITY

The QIN serves infants, toddlers and their families who are DC residents or in foster care. To be eligible, a child must be younger than age 3 and be part of a priority population, including:

- Families receiving public assistance TANF, SNAP or SSI
- Families with low incomes
- Families experiencing homelessness
